PICNIC POINT PUBLIC SCHOOL DISCIPLINE POLICY



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Rational:

At Picnic Point Public School we aim to assist the students to be self-disciplined, independent learners, whose esteem and worth have been fostered as an integral part of the growth of the whole person. We hope that the students' knowledge and experience of our caring for them will help them to know us as people who are doing our very best for their welfare. Such understanding should lead the student to develop a responsibility for their own behaviour.

School Discipline Code:

The Principal will:

- Provide strong and effective leadership of the school, staff, students and wider community in establishing and maintaining the highest tone and clear direction for the school.
- Provide a safe, harmonious, effective learning environment for students and staff.

The staff will:

- Provide a stable, safe and ordered environment within which students learn effectively and behave responsibly.
- Foster in the students a feeling of belonging to the school and its community.
- Promote pride in the school and inspire in students a sense of common purpose.
- Promote in students a respect for the values that underpin our society and its laws.
- Insist upon responsible student behaviour.
- Provide effective classrooms that promote enthusiasm for learning in an atmosphere free from disruptions.
- Develop practices which ensure responsible student behaviour.

The students will:

- Abide by the school's CARES rules.
- Develop self discipline by accepting responsibility for their own behaviour.
- Value the personal dignity and worth of themselves and others.

The parents will:

- Enter into a partnership with the school to achieve a productive and harmonious learning environment based on shared responsibility and mutual respect.
- Share a commitment to provide opportunities for students to take responsibilities for their own actions and learning.
- Share a responsibility for students developing socially acceptable behaviour.
- Support the school in the application of the School Discipline Policy.
- Support parent organisations and their part in the day to day running of the school.

As a result of the sensitive and cooperative implementation of the School Discipline Policy, students will be equipped to participate fully in the learning activities that are being offered.

School Rules:

The students will adhere to the school rules based on the acronym "CARES"

- **C** Correct choices
- A Always be in the right place
- R Respect & responsibility
- **E** Engage in learning
- **S** Safety

Rights & Responsibilities:

Students'

I have the right to:

- be happy and to be treated with understanding.
- be treated with respect and politeness.
- be safe.
- expect my property to be safe.
- obtain maximum benefit from all lessons and classes.
- be proud of my school.
- have a pleasant, clean and well maintained school and grounds.
- develop self discipline.
- my own opinion.

I have the responsibility to:

- with understanding and respect I must not hurt others feelings.
- not to hurt anyone.
- not to take or destroy the property of others.
- cooperate with teachers and other students and to make sure that lessons proceed and to always do my best.
- be punctual, to attend school regularly and to participate actively in all school activities.
- bring credit to myself, my family and my school.
- care for the school environment.
- exhibit self control.
- respect the opinion of others.

Strategies

Expectations of good discipline in NSW Public Schools

NSW public schools have the following requirements of all students:

- Sustained application to learning.
- Respect for other individuals and their learning.
- Courtesy to other students, to teachers and to community members.
- Due respect for teachers.
- No violence, discrimination, harassment, bullying or intimidation.
- No weapons.
- No illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco.
- Peaceful resolution of conflict.
- Adherence to the standards of dress determined by the school community.
- Compliance with all school rules and the School Discipline policy.

While meeting these expectations, students also have the right to expect courtesy, fairness, respect and excellence in teaching.

Students and teachers have a right to be safe and happy at school. They have a right to be treated fairly and with dignity.

Keeping classroom and school rules positive and to the minimum helps to develop cooperative and responsible attitudes in the students. Trust and respect between students and teachers are basic to any positive reinforcement and behaviour modification program.

Strategies to promote good discipline & effective learning

To encourage effective discipline the school will:

- Provide appropriate curriculum to meet the needs of each child.
- Support students in achieving success in learning.
- Promote school and classroom rules that are fair, clear and consistently applied.
- Discuss with parents their role in promoting acceptable student behaviour.
- Promote consistent teacher development and training.
- Provide students with appropriate support programs e.g. counselling, remediation, behaviour modification.
- Provide programs that develop self discipline, self evaluation, communication and conflict resolution skills. e.g. personal development, peer support and leadership opportunities.

To achieve acceptable levels of behaviour and performance teachers will:

• Develop and encourage a caring atmosphere.

- Use every opportunity to be positive with students and reward for all levels of achievement/growth.
- Be consistent in expectations.
- Be seen to be fair in the eyes of the students.
- Help students to be responsible for their actions.
- Explain the school rules for student understanding.
- Give rational explanations when disciplining.
- Search for the cause of the misbehaviour.
- Involve all stakeholders when information would be helpful.

Consequences:

Dependent upon the nature of the infringement, the student will receive a verbal warning depending on the severity. If the infringement is repeated:

- The student is issued with a "Red Slip" and parents are informed via letter.
- The issuing teacher records the incident in Sentral Wellbeing module.
- The issuing teacher then ensures that the parent returns the signed notification and updates the incident in Sentral Wellbeing module to reflect the return.
- Counselling/discussion is offered by school staff to support the student into making correct choices.
- A Red Slip will exclude a student from the end of term reward.
- Each term commences with a clean record for each student.

- 2 Achievement awards = 1 gold Principal's award

Positive playground awards

- Issued for positive behaviour in playground
- Prizes are awarded weekly to winners

In the classroom

Teachers follow individual methods of rewards and recognition within their classrooms, including house points, table/group points, small prizes or verbal recognition etc.

Weekly assembly awards are presented at whole school assemblies.
