GYMNASTICS

This week was our last gymnastics session. The children enjoyed the program and certainly took their skills and agility to another level. They were able to demonstrate their grit and enthusiasm in these lessons and every single student worked to their personal best.

SPORT IN SCHOOLS

Sport in Schools will replace gymnastics next term, starting in Week 2. This is another fitness and skills based program run by professional instructors. The set up of equipment at numerous stations means that students rotate through various skills and there is no waiting time. 
CANTERBURY ALL SCHOOLS

On Monday, 18th June, our boys Under 11s Rugby League team travelled to The Crest Sporting Complex to compete in the Canterbury All Schools Competition. Despite what had to be one of the coldest days of 2018, our boys were determined to add the Under 11s title to the Under 10s title they won last year. The day started with an easy win with a forfeit against Greenacre PS and was followed up with a gutsy 16-12 win over Salamah College. In the third round the boys played an undefeated St Christopher's Holsworthy in what was shaping as a winner takes all clash. The boys put on one of their best performances of the day with aggressive line speed and solid contact stopping the opposition in their tracks. 
