SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS FOR YEAR 7 2020

Selective high schools cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 14 March 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply next term. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). Detailed instructions on how to apply online has been email to all Year 5 parents. The application website will open on the 9th October 2018 and closes on Monday 12th November 2018. No late applications will be accepted. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance. Please note that you can submit only ONE application for each student.

In the last Kalori I announced that our school will again be participating in the Partners in Learning Parent Survey. Thank you to those who have already completed the survey. The best part of Jump Rope for Heart was that we all got to exercise and get fit while raising money to support research into the Heart Foundation's lifesaving research and health projects. I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank all our wonderful families and community members who contributed to the \$10,000 we raised over the term.

SOME GENTLE REMINDERS



Triple P is a parenting program for all families that provides practical answers to everyday parenting concerns. All parents with children aged up to 12 years can attend, however this program is most effective with children aged 3 to 8 years.

Seminar 1 - An overview of the principles of positive parenting. Seminar topics include:

- creating a safe, interesting and positive learning environment
- · using assertive discipline
- having realistic expectations
- taking care of yourself as a parent
