ROAD SAFETY AROUND OUR SCHOOL TO KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE

Recently, I have received information from a number of concerned parents who have seen vehicles double-parked, parked across driveways (even our driveway), parked in disabled spaces and no stopping areas and making U-turns on double lines on Prince St & Thomas St at pick-up and drop-off times. The safety of all our children is paramount here at PPPS and I urge everyone to please respect the rules of the road in order to keep our children safe and to also respect our neighbours by parking appropriately and allowing them to enter and exit their driveways as they need to. Thank you to everyone for your cooperation and support when driving around our school to ensure that all our little ones make it to school and back home again safely each and every day.

WOOLWORTHS EARN & LEARN

Our school has registered for the Woolworths 'earn & learn' program again this year. Information about how it works, along with a sticker sheet will be sent to all families at the beginning of next term. We are by no means suggesting you should shop at Woolworths, but if you choose to, you will receive one sticker for every \$10 spent. When you collect enough stickers to fill your entire sheet, we would be grateful if you could bring it to the front office and place it in the green Woolworths earn & learn box. The program commences on 1st May and concludes on 25th June. At the conclusion, we will count how many stickers our school community have collected and handed in. We will then be able to redeem the stickers for our choice of educational resources for all our students to access at school.

CREDIT & DEBIT CARD CHANGES – BEGINNING TERM 2

Over the years, regulations around the safe keeping of credit and debit card information have evolved with the increased use of electronic systems and payments. Schools must ensure the safety of all credit and/or debit card information provided to the school for payment. As a result, we will no longer be able to ask for, or accept written credit and debit card information. This means that schools may only process credit/debit card payments when:

- the payer (usually the parent) presents at the counter with the card for insertion or swiping directly into the EFTPOS terminal
- the payer has telephoned the school to make a payment (the information must be keyed directly into the EFTPOS terminal while the payer is still on the phone.)
- the payer completes a Parent Online Payment (POP) through the school website.

The credit card details are never to be written down. Therefore please ignore the credit card number/expiry section on our payment envelopes; we will have them updated with that section removed shortly.

Shared Language of Learning

This section focuses on the Shared Language of Learning that is used at PPPS. It is designed to enhance communication and understanding about learning and progress across the school community

THE Learning PIT

"Grow through what you go through"



Definition

The Learning Pit was created by James Nottingham and is a metaphor/analogy for the place we go when we are faced with a challenge or in the process of learning new knowledge. We get dirty and it can be hard, sometimes really hard, but it is a good place to be because if we use our Learner Qualities we can always make it to the other side and we are better for it.

Why The Learning Pit?

The Learning Pit shows students that it is ok to not know and that not knowing is not failure but rather a chance to grow. It promotes the idea of a growth mindset and builds a positive learning culture in the school where students are not afraid to fail and actively seek challenges, focussing on growth rather than levels.

Language of Learning Challenge

Discuss with your kids a time when you have been in the Learning Pit and what Learner Qualities you used to get out.

The Learning Pit can be hard to get into, especially under pressure. It can be very hard to admit you don't know something, and even harder to ask for help. But by jumping into the Learning Pit, you will learn new things, and enjoy yourself more and more with each challenge you complete.

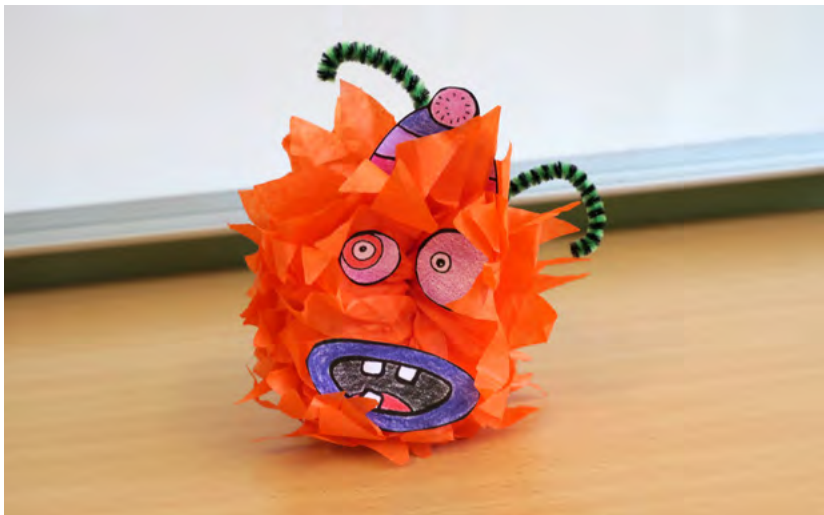

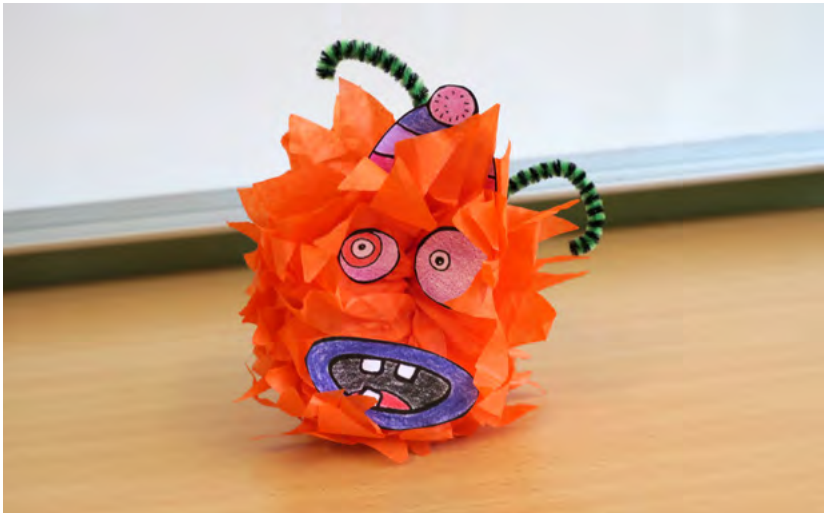
