CHILDREN'S CROSSING – UNDERSTANDING HOW THEY WORK

We all know how Pedestrian (Zebra) Crossings work as they are very common and we encounter them almost every day. However, how well do you know the rules for a Children's Crossing, like the one we have at the Thomas St gate? Did you know the following about Children's Crossings:

- Operate when the orange 'Children Crossing' flags are displayed
- Legally the strongest marked pedestrian crossings for managing traffic and road safety in the local streets around schools
- Offer more protection than zebra crossings
- By law, drivers must stop their car at the stop line and wait until all pedestrians on the crossing and those about to step onto the crossing have crossed the road
- Fines of \$572 and 4 demerit points apply
- Pedestrians must walk between the two red and white posts on each side of the road and keep within that area

DANCESPORT CHALLENGE

This year was Picnic Point Public School's fourth year in the Dancesport Challenge and we were very proud to be one of 46 schools participating across two nights. Finally, I'd like to thank and acknowledge the multi-talented Mr Peter Campbell, who is not only one of our skilled School Learning Support Officers, but also our DanceSport teacher whom we have been very fortunate to have with us again this year to take our students on this wonderful journey.

ADDITION TO SCHOOL UNIFORM – NEW GIRLS SHORTS OPTION FOR SUMMER

The NSW Department of Education has revised the School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines following an extensive review and consultation process, including with the NSW Parents and Citizens Association. One of the revised School Uniform Policy requirements is for girls to have the option to wear shorts and pants.

Following consultation with parents at P&C meetings, students and staff, I am pleased to announce the new girls' shorts option for our summer uniform, consisting of a white, short-sleeved, Peter Pan collared blouse, maroon shorts (culottes or unisex shorts specified below), white socks and black leather shoes. Suppliers of our PPPS uniform, MUE and Claudine's, have kindly provided their current prices on the stock indicated below:

It is important to note that Skorts are a different style of shorts and not an option for our uniform. They were considered, along with many other styles, but were not deemed the best option. I only mention this as some people may not be aware of the distinction.

All uniform items are now available from the above suppliers and they have updated their uniform lists for our school. Officially, these shorts become an option as of Term 4, however, if the weather warms up and our girls would like to begin wearing them sooner, they may do so. Please note that the shorts do not replace the summer dress, nor are they compulsory. Our girls now simply have the option of the summer dress or shorts and blouse which will be tucked in.

STATE BOYS AND GIRLS KNOCKOUT TOUCH

The past two weeks have seen our boys' and girls' knockout teams compete in 3 matches. The girls faced off against Bradbury PS in the Sydney South West Knockout Final. Despite applying pressure and asking questions, the girls started slowly. However, as the first half wore on, the girls established a solid 4-1 lead. The girls continued this dominance and went on to win the match 9-1. This continues their run of consecutive SSW knockout titles to 5 years. The girls now move on to face Werrington County next week in their Round 6 clash.

The boys have played two matches in this time. The first match was against a travelling Ellison PS. The boys started this match with enthusiasm and aggression and established an early lead through their powerful driving sets. The boys continued to build on their previous performance and came out 11-1 winners and booked themselves a place in the Sydney South West Knockout Final where they faced a Camden South PS team that had been winning comfortably. This match was always going to be difficult and Camden South tested us on our edges early. Despite making some half-breaks, our boys scrambled to continually protect the line. The boys adjusted quickly and after much patience and finding their drive they were able to open up a lead. Once the boys had capitalised on the match they were able to ensure they got the job done. A 7-2 win means our boys are now back-to-back SSW Knockout Champions and will await other results to play their Round 7 match. The boys are now in the top 16 teams in NSW in a competition that started with over 500. This is the best performance by the Picnic Point boys ever. Well done Boys!
