PEANUT ALLERGY REMINDER

At Picnic Point, we endeavour to be a 'nut friendly' school due to a number of our students with allergies which could lead to very serious symptoms.

SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS FOR YEAR 7 2021

Selective high schools cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 12th March 2020.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply next term. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). Detailed instructions on how to apply online has been emailed to all Year 5 parents. The application website will open on the 8th October 2019 and closes on Monday 11th November 2019. **No late applications will be accepted.** More information on how to apply can be found at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/.shs-oc>

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance. Please note that you can submit only ONE application for each student.

A note with more information went home today. This note will also be available on the school's website in the notes section. Please make sure you return the tear off slip next term so we can keep you up to date on all information regarding Selective High School Applications.

BEE GRITTY



"When I look back, the things that define me as a person and make me who I am are the times when the world said 'you can't' and I just stood tall and announced 'I can'. That is what grit is and that is who I am"

Definition

Being gritty is the ability to face challenges with a self-belief that they are surmountable. It's being able to set high expectations and meaningful goals and have the fortitude to pursue them with passion and effort; persevering through mistakes and setbacks with gritted teeth and determination until your goals are accomplished.

Why Grit?

Grit builds resilience and allows our students to set meaningful goals; working towards them with consistent effort and the belief that they can succeed, regardless of setbacks. Studies have shown that having a gritty growth mindset and an innate sense of self-belief are key factors and indicators in the level of success and accomplishment that one is able to achieve.

Language of Learning Challenge

Think about a task that challenged you at work, school or as a child; one that provided obstacles, setbacks and failures, but through sheer grit (perseverance, passion & effort) you were able to accomplish it. Discuss with your child what it was about this task that stood in the way of you accomplishing it and how you used grit to succeed. Ask your child if they have had any similar experiences in their learning.

CLAIMING A REWARD:

To claim a reward, simply send 10 silver tokens and a completed reward coupon (or a little note) in with your child's normal School Banking deposit on a Tuesday. Reward coupons are available on request through School banking, from the office staff or can be printed at home from the Commonwealth Bank website. Once we have received the reward claim, it takes approximately 1-2 weeks for the Bank to post the item to us.

REMINDERS:

- Silver tokens cannot be shared or pooled together with friends and family. Please keep them separated.
- Check on the reward coupon for when each item is released. For example: Water Skimming Bounce Ball is available to claim from Term 4.
- Once ordered, rewards can take approximately 1 - 2 weeks to be delivered and distributed.
- We cannot accept foreign currency via the School Banking program.
- A cheque can be deposited through school banking provided the cheque is made payable to the name of the child into whose account it is being deposited. A great option for Birthday money!

DID YOU KNOW?

Older and/or younger siblings can also bank through the child currently at primary school. Simply send in their own completed bank deposit book with the child who currently attends. They can even be kept together with an elastic band if you would prefer, but it's not necessary.

ANY QUESTIONS?

If you ever have a question about School Banking, please feel free to write a little note and place it inside your child's deposit wallet. However, if it is a bank account balance you are after, you will need to visit your local Commonwealth Bank branch or call 13 2221 for this information.
