#### **COVID 19 UPDATE**

The department has been working very closely with NSW Health to ease some restrictions for the rest of Term 4.

The summary below is a snapshot of some of the most recent changes:

- Scripture lessons will continue and our combined scripture assembly is on 4 December.
- Excursions and overnight camps are allowed with a relevant COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- **Presentation Day** assembly will go ahead, *but there will be no parent audience*. We will video (and hopefully live stream) the event.
- P&C meetings are now allowed onsite, must occur outside of school hours and are limited to a *maximum of 20 people*. All attendees must sign the visitor form upon arrival, physically distance and adhere to hygiene measures. Our next P&C meeting will be held on **Tuesday 8 December in the hall at 7:00pm**. An email will be sent closer to the date, to determine the maximum people.
- Parents and carers are only allowed on the school site to purchase or pick up uniforms from the uniform shop in the hall, to volunteer in the canteen, for the purpose of picking up their sick child or for essential meetings with teachers and/or school executives.
- Year 6 Farewell will proceed, with guidelines, and a COVID-19 Safety Plan. (see Stage 3).

Crossing over to Bare Island, students heard fascinating stories, participated in activities such as dressing up in convict and soldier uniforms and saw first hand many artefacts used in the past by both the Aboriginal and European people from the time of Cook's landing. Our guides were extremely knowledgeable and answered any questions the students had. We were lucky to be blessed with a beautiful day and an amazingly smooth bus run! All the teachers wish to congratulate our students on the learner qualities they displayed - demonstrating their knowledge, asking lots of quality questions, listening attentively and participating with zest and joy in all the activities. To top off our fantastic experience, the students' behaviour was impeccable (as we expect at Picnic Point) and we received very positive comments and praise from the guides. It is also important for our young people to recognise not only the traditional ways of the Aboriginal and Torres Islander groups, but also the achievements and success of their descendants in more contemporary times and today.

#### LIFE EDUCATION

The Life Education van (or Healthy Harold as the children prefer to call it) visited our school this week and all classes K-4 had a session on various topics. Our Year 3 students learnt all about the different body systems and what they do. Year 4 participated in the topic 'Mind your Medicine', which builds onto the Year 3 topic in more detail and maturity. To me NAIDOC Week is a celebration of how far we have come as a country. Not even 60 years ago Aboriginal people couldn't even vote, to today where people are more accepting of other people's cultures and understand the importance of living together in harmony.

My message for NAIDOC Week would be to take time to get to know your country's history. We're all Australian and it's a powerful thing to have knowledge about our own country and move forward as one.
