P&C DONATIONS TO THE SCHOOL

At our first P&C meeting, a motion was passed to support the school by providing \$2000 for each Stage to purchase educational resources. As the year progresses, we will have a number of items that we hope to purchase for the education of our children, so please consider helping our enthusiastic fund raising committee to support our students' learning.

PROJECT FIRESTORM

We had an exciting day on Tuesday this week at PPPS, with the Department of Education launching their new project for teaching STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), educating our students about fire safety, and captured by Channel 7 (see our facebook page). Thank you to Mr Bill Narris, Mrs Pammie Chatterton, Miss Carter, Mrs Colusso, students of 5/6 Samuri and 5/6 Suzuki for their involvement in the launch of Project Firestorm. I was so impressed with our students' high order thinking as they explored the impact of bushfires and worked towards innovative, viable and empathetic solutions.

VARIATION TO TERM 4 SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT DAYS – SCHOOL CLOSED 18 DECEMBER - 27 JANUARY

As you may be aware, the last two days of each school year are called School Development Days (SDDs). These are pupil-free days for the purpose of providing professional learning for staff. This year the SDDs are scheduled for Thursday 17 December and Friday 18 December. While these days are crucial for staff development, they are not always at an optimal time of year to put learning into practice. Following community consultation through P&C and approval from the Director, staff will complete 2 x 3 ½ hr training sessions after school throughout the year in lieu of the last SDD. We are doing this in order to access

professional learning at a more advantageous time of the year so we can immediately implement our school planning priorities and add value to student achievement. Our first training session is scheduled for next Monday where we will be receiving professional development in assessment strategies for learning. In addition, our office staff Sue Trees, Kim Pryde and Rebecca O'Donovan will complete additional training outside of school hours in lieu of the last SDD to fulfil their roles. As a result, the school (including the front office) will close for the summer holidays at 3:30pm on Thursday 17 December. The last day of school for our students is Wednesday 16 December. The office will re-open for the first SDD of next year on Wednesday 27 January 2021. Students return on Thursday 28 January. Many thanks in advance for your understanding.

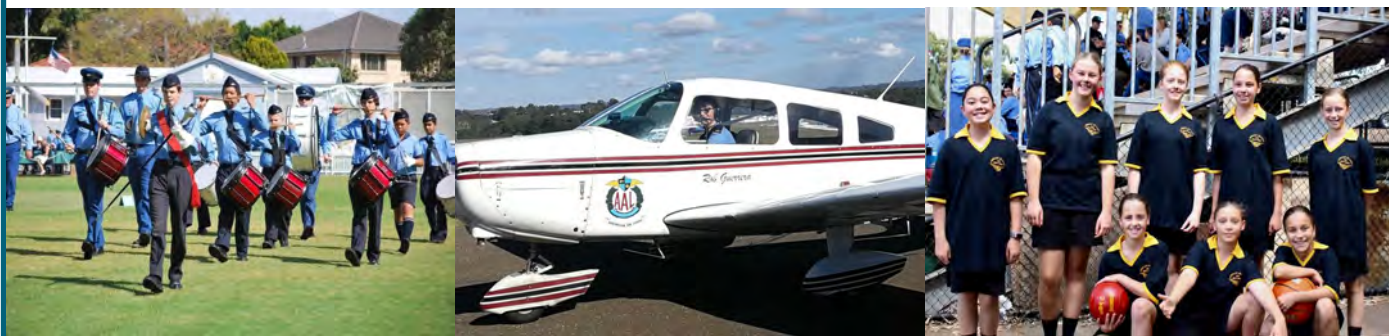
