BEE Motivated

"When life gives you lemons make lemonade"

Definition

Being Motivated is the attitude and the level of enthusiasm with which we approach a task. It is the Learner Quality that means we give our best. In particular being motivated allows students to internalise and personalise tasks, especially tasks that may not be their favourites. It allows students to see learning as an adventure rather than a chore.

Why Motivation?

Research has shown that the attitude with which an individual approaches a task has a dramatic impact on their level of achievement and the overall outcome of the task. We have found that students who approach tasks and their learning with a motivated attitude, have increased growth and results. Furthermore, students are able to connect with the learning, rather than seeing it as an abstract concept that they only do at school. This is the first step to our students becoming lifelong learners.



Language of Learning Challenge

Think of a task you don't like to do or have been putting off and find a way to personalise it or make it an adventure. It might be building, creating or cleaning. Approach the task with a positive mindset and motivation and see how it changes the way you feel about it and the end product.
