YEAR 6 FAREWELL

Excitement is definitely ramping up among the Year 6 students for their night of nights! There has been some talk about the students having dates for the farewell, we are asking your help to squash this as it is inappropriate and unnecessary. It's a party to celebrate the seven excellent years of education and friendship and make some life long memories!

Dress for the evening is smart casual, it's always lovely to see everyone dressed appropriately for their age.

Before the evening you will be able to meet in Lambeth Park between 5:00pm and 5:45pm for photos together. The parents will then need to transport their children to Revesby Workers Club.

Due to the current Public Health Orders children under 16 years of age who are not fully vaccinated can attend as long as they are accompanied by a fully vaccinated adult member of their household. The accompanying adult:

- must sign the child into the venue using the QR code and then is able to leave the child in the care of supervising teachers and staff, then return to collect the child at the conclusion of the function
- must remain on the premises for the duration of the function before collecting the child when the function concludes
- must follow all the venue's COVID-safe practices when checking in and out.

If you are not vaccinated, you are permitted to escort your child to the back entrance door of the club, near the multi-story car park, where you and your child will be met by a PPPS staff member. The PPPS staff member will escort your child inside. Our PPPS staff member will call your mobile as we finish and escort your child back to the same door of the club, where they will meet you.

Mrs Chatterton will be putting together her usual DVD, double vaccinated parents are allowed to join us at the end of the night as the room has capacity to allow for required social distancing. Parents are asked to please wear a mask. If you are unable to join us, Mrs Chatterton will include photos from the night on a DVD and for a \$5 donation to purchase, with the money going directly into the Year 6's fundraising for next year.
