#### **BEE MINDFUL**

"We are the masters of our own destiny"

#### Definition

Being Mindful is about freeing ourselves from the stresses of the past and our anxieties about the future. It is our ability to understand the 'why' behind what we do and what we feel. It is a powerful skill that allows us to be in control of whom we are and who we are becoming in every moment.



#### Why Mindful?

Students who can recognise the 'why' behind their emotions, actions and learning are able to be in control of these aspects of their lives. They can self-manage and assess where they are and where they need to go. Studies have shown that children and adults who possess advanced mindfulness skills are better able to deal with challenges, have more resilience and have reduced anxiety levels.

Thank you all again for a fantastic Colour Run Event!!!

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
