#### SEMESTER ONE REPORTS AND PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Teachers are currently working towards creating Semester One reports as a reflection of the learning completed through Term 1 and most of Term 2. These reports will go home to parents and carers in your child's bag on Thursday 23 June. Parent Teacher interviews will be conducted from Friday 24 June to Thursday 30 June. The parent teacher interviews are booked through the Sentral portal and bookings will open on Tuesday 14 June. Remember that you are welcome to arrange an interview with your child's teacher at any time if you have concerns or questions.

#### WINTER UNIFORM - REMINDER

As the weather has started to become a little cooler, especially in the mornings, students may wear their winter uniform to school, but it is not compulsory yet. From Week 8, 13 June (after the long weekend) all students must be in full winter uniform.

Girls winter dress	Tartan tunic, white long-sleeved Peter Pan collared shirt (rounded collar) with maroon tab, maroon tights, black school shoes. A maroon school jumper/jacket and maroon fleecy zip up micro fibre waterproof jacket.
Girls winter pants	Maroon trousers, white long-sleeved peter pan collared shirt (with tab) or white skivvy (no maroon tab required), white socks, black school shoes. A maroon school jumper/jacket and maroon fleecy zip up micro fibre waterproof jacket.
Boys winter	Long grey trousers, sky blue long-sleeved shirt, (white skivvy is also acceptable), grey socks, black school shoes. A maroon school jumper/jacket and maroon fleecy zip up micro fibre waterproof jacket.
Boys sports	Royal blue shorts, sky blue polo shirt with embroidered emblem, white sport shoes, white socks.
Girls sports	Royal blue sports skirt or shorts, sky blue polo shirt with embroidered emblem, white socks, white sports shoes.
Unisov sports tracksuit	Maroon tracknants, maroon school jumper/jacket and maroon fleecy zin up micro

**Unisex sports tracksuit** Maroon trackpants, maroon school jumper/jacket and maroon fleecy zip up micro fibre waterproof jacket.

Up until the long weekend, students must wear either summer or winter uniform, but not a mix of both. Eg. girls wearing summer uniform must wear white socks NOT maroon stockings.

No other clothing is permitted under the uniform. e.g. black leggings under dresses, skivvies under girls summer dress or boys short sleeved shirts.

Thank you for your support in maintaining our strong sense of school pride through enabling our children to wear their uniforms well.

Please ensure *all* pieces of you child's uniform are *clearly* labelled with their name.

### Shared Language of Learning

# THE LEARNING PROCESS

"Knowing how to learn is the most powerful tool of all"

#### Definition

The Learning Process represents the steps we go through when learning new information or when learning/improving a skill. The Learning Process in itself is a skill, meaning it can be learnt and improved. It consists of three fluid stages: Building Knowledge, Making Meaning and Applying Understanding.

Building Knowledge is the process of researching and gathering information before we start. Making Meaning is our ability to understand the information we have gathered and use it to make a plan forward. Applying Understanding is putting our plan in to action through experimenting and trialling. If it works, great, if it doesn't work, we need to reflect and go back through the steps to work out if we need to build more knowledge or make better meaning of our information.



#### Why The Learning Process?

By our students understanding and being able to recognise and break down the steps that they go through when learning new information and skills, they are able to start becoming self-sufficient learners. They are able to see what they want to achieve and make a detailed plan using the process about how they are going to get there. They develop the ability to become in control of when, how and what they learn because they become able to understand and recognise where they are and what they have to do to achieve what they want. It instils the ideals that 'I can accomplish whatever I put my mind to'.

#### Language of Learning Challenge

Pick a task you have never completed before, it can be building something, learning a new skill or recipe. While you complete it, see if you can recognise yourself moving through the steps of Building Knowledge (Pinterest, google, books, where do I start?), Making Meaning (how is this going to work for my situation? What's my plan?), Applying Understanding (We have a plan, let's give it a go?). If it doesn't turn out the way you thought, see which step you might need to revisit to make it so.

#### NAPLAN

Congratulations to our Year 3 students on completing their NAPLAN assessment. We are proud of the calm and orderly behaviour they displayed while undertaking the online tests. We ask parents not to put stress on this assessment - remember it is just one snapshot - a little window into your child's learning continuum.

#### SWIMMING SCHEME

As the swim scheme concludes, we have seen a steady improvement over the past two weeks - not just the amazing growth most students have made in their swimming skills, but also their behaviour and organisation. We are proud to share the beautiful compliments we have been receiving from the teachers at Revesby Swim Centre - they are for you, parents!

#### PORTFOLIOS

Can we please remind parents again that your child needs to bring a portfolio for their work samples. You can purchase one from the office or any stationery store - it is not absolutely vital to have the school logo on it. A folder with plastic sleeves is fine, but it should have at least 30 display sleeves. We want the children to value their work, display it neatly and share it proudly with their parents. Please send one with your child as soon as possible.

#### **HOMEWORK EXPECTATIONS IN STAGE 2**

All students in Stage 2 are expected to finish a certain amount of homework every week. This is to revise schoolwork, but more importantly, to develop consistency, organisation and important habits for senior school and high school.

The weekly homework given is: Home Reading, Maths Plus Mentals work (teachers will set a minimum amount for individual students) and writing out their spelling list 3 times. Optional extension work is offered to students who are interested. Parents, please provide a quiet, comfortable work space and if possible, devote time each week to show interest in your child's work and to share some reading. Turning it into a pleasant experience will make a huge difference. If your child is struggling, please see the class teacher - it is not expected that you will take responsibility for your child's homework. Thank you for your continued support!

#### **OWN DEVICES FOR YEAR 4 (BYOD)**

Last term, we sent notes to Year 4 parents, with information about purchasing a device for your child, to start using in preparation for senior school. While it is not compulsory and we understand it may be an inconvenient expense at the moment, we are aware that many of you have purchased one - thank you! We have held off for the past four weeks due to NAPLAN and the swim scheme and will now be sending home a contract, to highlight the rules and expectations of bringing and caring for your own device. Your teacher will also let you know on which days devices will be required at school - at this stage, it will not be every day.

We want to assure you again that if your child does not have his/her own device, they will not miss out or be disadvantaged in any way, as we have Chromebooks to supplement the numbers.

#### JELLYBEANS MAKE UP LESSONS

On Wednesday of Weeks 5 and 6, all Stage 2 classes will have their Jellybeans music lessons to make up for two missed sessions in Term 1. They will be observed and assessed on their skills and progress. If your child has taken their recorder home to practise, please ensure they bring it back on Monday.

### Stage 3

#### CANBERRA

Next term we'll start learning about government ahead of our Canberra Camp. If you are using the payment schedule you will have made a payment in Week 2 and the next one will be in Week 5. This is just a reminder so it doesn't sneak up.

#### SCIENCE ASSIGNMENT

By now the students should be well into their assignment on 'Growth and Survival of Living Things' This assignment is designed to take 5 Weeks to complete. This is the sort of assignment that the students will be receiving in high school. It is designed to not only teach them about the topic and the scientific process but also about time management.

#### JELLYBEANS

Now that NAPLAN is over we will be resuming our Jellybean program. We still have a few outstanding payments and notes to come in. Please make sure you have forwarded these to the office. Thank you to those families who have already paid.

#### **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

This week students have been presenting their speeches. From this two students per class will be chosen to represent their class at the Stage competition in Week 5. The top two students will then go on to represent Stage 3 at the 2022 Multicultural Perspective Public Speaking Competition.

#### BYOD

We are becoming a little concerned that some students are becoming a little complacent about our BYOD program. All students who have signed the agreement need to ensure that devices are fully charged and at school each day (Monday – Thursday). Under no circumstances are personal devices used by another student and it is the responsibility of each student to ensure their device is safely stored at recess and lunch times.

We have seen that some students are using their devices to email or message each other. The students are aware that if this happens in class time their device will be confiscated until the end of the day. The students' devices are a learning tool and not for social or gaming purposes while within the school grounds.
