From this Monday:

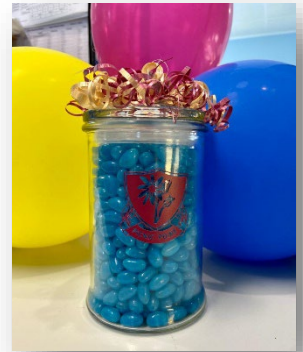
- unvaccinated staff and volunteers are able to work in department schools again

## Shared Language of Learning

# BEE BRAVE

*"Bravery is not the absence of fear but rather the courage to face our fears and move forward"*

### Definition

Bravery is our student's ability to face challenges, tasks and learning with the belief that they can succeed. Bravery allows our students to be confident when faced with new challenges and take risks to improve their learning and themselves. For example, Bravery can be as small as putting your hand up and saying *"I'm not sure"* or as big as giving a speech in front of the whole school.

### Why Bravery?

Studies have shown that addressing and overcoming 'fears' in learning directly leads to improved performance and engagement levels and that if someone is brave for long enough, it turns into confidence, which is simply bravery without the fear.



### Language of Learning Challenge

Your challenge if you are *'brave'* enough to accept, is to have a conversation with your child and share an experience of how bravery has helped you and conversely ask them, have they been brave this week?

## Stage 1

### **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

The South Primary Public Speaking Competition begins for all children in Term 3. Each student will need to prepare a speech on any topic of interest suitable for a school audience. The Stage 1 class competitions will be held during Week 5 of Term 3, with stage finals held during Week 6. One winner from each division will be selected on merit to attend the Regional Finals, which will be held later in the term. All students must prepare their speech at home; however, teachers are providing information and lessons in class to help students with their speech and impromptu speech if required.

### **KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS 2023**

We have begun taking Kindergarten enrolments for 2023. If your child is starting Kindergarten next year, please go to the school's website, click on the enrolment tab and read the information. ### **LABEL ALL BELONGINGS**

Please remember to label everything, including clothing and lunch boxes. During these winter months, as the temperatures rise throughout the day, there are numerous items of clothing left lying around the playground at recess at lunch, many being brand new jumpers, wet weather school jackets and tracksuit pants with no name.

### **HOW TO HELP CHILDREN SLEEP WELL**

A good night's sleep is important for a child's growth, learning and development. At this age children need **10 - 11 hours sleep a night**. They are usually tired after school and might look forward to bedtime from about 7:30pm.

#### **Bedtime routine**

A bedtime routine is very important at this age. It helps your child wind down from the day.

A bedtime routine might look like this:

6:30 pm: all screens and devices turned off and put away. All devices stored in a family space.

6:45 pm: put on pyjamas, brush teeth, go to the toilet.

7:15 pm: quiet time in the bedroom with a book and a bedtime story or quiet chat.

7:30 pm: goodnight and lights out.

A good night's sleep is about getting to sleep, staying asleep and getting enough good-quality sleep. Here is a link with some ideas that can help your child get the sleep they need if you would like more information.

#### **Screen time impact on sleep**

Using screens can affect how quickly your child falls asleep and how long they sleep. Below are some reasons why sleep is affected and ways to reduce the negative impacts:

- Screen use in the hour before bed can stimulate your child.
- Blue light from televisions, computer screens, phones and tablets might suppress melatonin levels and delay sleepiness.

- Avoid screen use in the hour before bedtime. This includes mobile phones, tablets, computer screens and TV.
- Limit and monitor violent content at any time of day because this can affect sleep regardless of the time and length of use.
- Have a family rule that mobile phones and other devices are left in a family room overnight.

This is a fantastic tour and study of 'what life was like' during early colonisation and of the first contacts between First Nations owners of this land and the European newcomers.

For Year 3, we are looking at booking an excursion to the Royal National Park and will give you more information soon.

### DISCO WRAP UP

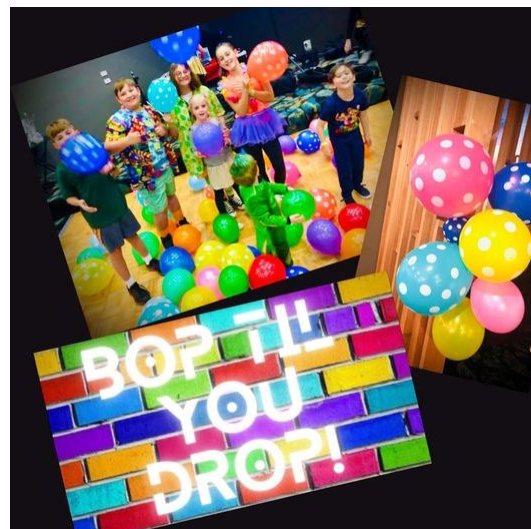

BreastScreen NSW is a government funded screening program for the early detection of breast cancer. The program is designed for women with no symptoms of breast cancer. Women with symptoms should see their doctor without delay.

BreastScreen adheres to strict quality standards. Every screening mammogram is read independently by two specially trained doctors.
