


"I liked the Red Panda because it is nearly extinct. I liked feeding the kangaroos and the wallabies, sometimes

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Attendance at school is a most important matter. The higher the student's attendance, the higher their outcomes will be, including academic, social and emotional.



Students are expected to be at school unless there are clear medical reasons why they are not able to be, such as displaying cold and flu-like symptoms. 'Learning from home' is no longer an option available to students unless the school is closed, and a clear directive has been issued.

We value your support in ensuring your child is present at school each day ready for learning.

ICAS COMPETITION

Next week students will be participating in the ICAS English Competition. Years 3 & 4 on Tuesday and 5 & 6 on Wednesday. Students will need to be at school at 7:45am sharp so the tests can run smoothly and be ready for the school day at 9:00am. We will meet at the steps of the computer room.

We discussed the ICAS assessments being held at school at the P&C zoom meeting last Tuesday. We have decided to no longer run the ICAS Competition at PPPS from 2023. Here are a number of reasons why:

- The entire grade does not sit the test and therefore it cannot be used in conjunction with other school assessments.
- We are currently using other external forms of assessment, such as the Check In Assessment, that are cost-free, aligned to the current NSW syllabuses and completed by all students.
- ICAS is run by a private company and no longer aligned with the University of NSW. The company draws on school resources to set up and administer the tests and print the certificates. This is not an equitable use of school resources for all students.
- As the tests are now online, it creates some practical difficulties for the school.
- The tests are costly to families and cost the teacher's valuable time in running them. Time we would rather see spent on preparing for lessons or providing student feedback.

Whilst we understand this change in practice will be disappointing to some parents, it does not mean that your child cannot participate. There are a number of schools making this same decision and so ICAS has set up test centres. If you wish your children to sit the test in 2023 you can take them to the JEM (Janison Exam Management) Testing Centre in Ultimo on a Saturday. Dates to be communicated next year.
