#### ABORIGINAL 'TELL YOUR STORY' DAY

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students and their families from the Bankstown schools are invited to attend Picnic Point Public School for 'Tell Your Story' Day on Wednesday 1 March. They will participate in a day of connecting with their identity and their culture through engaging in authentic literacy activities and sharing stories, with the view to support students in becoming published authors.

The day will begin with a smoking ceremony performed by Russell Dawson and Aunty Carol Brown and then students and their families will participate in four activities led by various Aboriginal authors/linguists/performers/artists and sports people.

#### **ECO-SCHOOLS**

This year, we are part of the Eco-school's group, sponsored by Canterbury Bankstown Council. Over the year, we will be working with specialists to help us to set up sustainable eco-practices in the school which will in time reduce our environmental print on the planet. As part of the process, our school will be officially certified as an eco-school according to the set criteria, after we participate in the program. We are hoping to get the highest certification and be one of the first schools in Bankstown to be certified as a 'green' eco-school. More information to follow.

#### STRIPED MARSH FROG COLONY

Our last Working Bee resulted in the front of the school being greatly improved. So much so, that a colony of indigenous striped marsh frogs have moved into the old water feature. Mr Arthur White, a local frog expert, confirmed and checked the species last week. The frogs/tadpoles should exist harmoniously at the front of the school and are great for reducing flies and mosquitoes. Our students will have the opportunity to look at these tadpoles/frogs and how they develop as we engage in learning about the local ecology in class. One thing we must remember is that frogs should never be touched by human hands.

#### **SPORT**

We have been very lucky to receive a sporting grant and we have organised a 7 week AFL program for our Year 1 and 2 students. They had their first lesson today and thoroughly enjoyed learning new skills. There is no cost for this program.

Due to our in-school AFL program this term there will be no AFL clinics on Thursdays after school.

#### **YEARS 1 AND 2 DANCE GROUP**

Today we took down names of the students who are interested in trailing for dance. We will be holding auditions next Friday at lunchtime for our Years 1 and 2 dance group. These auditions will run for a few weeks and the students will be told before the end of term if they were successful.



#### **INDEPENDENCE**

Thank you to those families and students who have already adopted the 'KISS AND DROP' routine. We have found this settles our students much quicker and we appreciate your support.

We are very impressed with our K-2 students as they are beginning to settle into school routines. One favour we ask is that you practice these things to assist with independence in opening the following:

- Small packets and muesli bars
- Yoghurt
- Cheese strips

#### **PCIT - PARENT-CHILD INTERACTION THERAPY**

We are one of six schools in the Bankstown area to be part of a pilot program to support parents in managing K-2 students with challenging behaviours. This research project is just the second of its kind in Australia and we are leading the way in making sure that student wellbeing is a top priority.

A special therapy room has been established at Condell Park PS with financial contributions from the six partnered schools and working closely with researchers from the University of New South Wales. This program is done with preschool and K-2 families and is used to help parents and teachers learn effective ways of managing children's behaviour problems.

Early next week, all K-2 parents will be asked to complete a short survey about your child's behavioural, emotional, and social wellbeing at the beginning and end of the school year. This data will be de-identified and form part of the research into improving student wellbeing. It'll take you 10-15 minutes per survey, and you can do it online or using a paper-and-pencil. As this is part of a research project, we need to officially get your consent to collect this information from you, so you'll be asked to sign a permission slip at the start of the survey.

Participation is completely voluntary. If you choose to participate, you'll also be entered into a draw to win \$100 for your child's school, which can be spent on things like school supplies or a classroom excursion! Thank you for your support.

#### Stage 2

#### **JELLYBEANS**

Jellybeans is well underway and our specialist music teacher, Karen has been using her musical expertise to engage the students in a range of musical activities on the recorder, glockenspiel and a range of percussion instruments.

While some of the learning content appears challenging, our students are listening carefully and showing determination to improve each week.

#### **BYOD REMINDER**

This year our Year 4 students are bringing their own devices to school to support classroom learning and develop computer research skills. Year 4 students are responsible for bring their fully charged devices to school on the following days:

Please note that no child will be disadvantaged if they don't have their own device – they will have the use of a school Chromebook.

# NAPLAN Information for parents and carers 2023

#### Why do students do NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

## Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Schools have transitioned from paper-based to computer-based assessments. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are more engaging for students. One of the main benefits is tailored (or adaptive) testing, where the test presents questions which may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

#### What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

All government and non-government education authorities contribute to the development of NAPLAN test materials.

#### **Participation in NAPLAN**

NAPLAN is for everyone. ACARA supports inclusive testing so all students have the opportunity to participate in the national assessment program.

Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs.

Schools should work with parents/carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN. Adjustments should reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.

To help inform these decisions, you may consult the NAPLAN public demonstration site, the Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN, or our series of videos where parents/carers, teachers and students share their experiences in using NAPLAN adjustments.

In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.





## What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

## What if my school is closed on NAPLAN days?

Schools with compelling reasons may be given permission to schedule tests after the 9-day test window.

#### What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some familiarisation and explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and quidance.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

#### **NAPLAN** timetable

The NAPLAN test window is 9 days. This is to accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 15 March and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023. Schools are advised to schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

## How is my child's performance reported?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. This scale indicates whether the student is meeting expectations for the literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

#### How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents/carers may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review the effectiveness of programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see information about the performance of schools over time at myschool.edu.au.
